AN APRIL GIGGLE

April Fools' Day is celebrated in different countries on April 1 every year. Sometimes referred to as **All Fools' Day**, April 1 is not a national holiday, but is widely recognized and celebrated as a day when many people play all kinds of jokes and foolishness. The day is marked by the commission of good-humored or otherwise funny jokes, hoaxes, and other practical jokes of varying sophistication on friends, family members, teachers, neighbors, work associates, etc. Its origins are uncertain. Some see it as a celebration related to the turn of the seasons, while others believe it stems from the adoption of a new calendar.

In Scotland, April Fools' Day is traditionally called Hunt-the-Gowk Day ("gowk" is Scots for a cuckoo or a foolish person), although this name has fallen into disuse. The traditional prank is to ask someone to deliver a sealed message requesting help of some sort. In fact, the message reads "Dinna laugh, dinna smile. Hunt the gowk another mile". The recipient, upon reading it, will explain he can only help if he first contacts another person, and sends the victim to this person with an identical message, with the same result.

In modern times, people have gone to great lengths to create elaborate April Fools' Day hoaxes. Newspapers, radio and TV stations and Web sites have participated in the April 1 tradition of reporting outrageous fictional claims that have fooled their audiences. In 1957, the BBC reported that Swiss farmers were experiencing a record spaghetti crop and showed footage of people harvesting noodles from trees; numerous viewers were fooled. In 1985, *Sports Illustrated* tricked many of its readers when it ran a made-up article about a rookie pitcher named Sidd Finch who could throw a fastball over 168 miles per hour. In 1998, after

Burger King advertised a "Left-Handed Whopper," scores of clueless customers requested the fake sandwich.

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Many time we run digital modes in a remote location. This portable operation requires a radio that has the features we want, but needs low power consumption and maybe even battery power. Elecraft has come out with a new super QRP rig you can use for portable operation. The KX3 is a brand new model shown for the first time at the 2011 Dayton Hamvention. The unit runs all modes from 160 through 6 meters. It has a general coverage receiver also built in. It looks like a radio controlhead unit for an HF rig without the other part. They also have a 100 watt linear amp matched for it. The rig is the ultimate all mode QRP rig. Check it out by watching the videos on YouTube about it and looking it over at the Elecraft website. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we want to build our own projects to use with our other equipment. Microprocessors have gotten cheaper and the tools to use them are easier to work with. One of the cheapest Processors to work with is the PIC microprocessors. One style of these is the PICAXE line of microprocessors. These microprocessors are available in a number of different packages from 8-pin chip to 40-pin chips. More pins mean more power, a larger number of inputs and outputs with higher cost. The cheapest of these is the PICAXE 08M . You can buy these processors for as little as \$3.00 for each one. Companies sell a development board to use to



program this chip or you can build your own. These Microcomputers are used for small projects such as robotics and other electronics projects. The PICAXE 08M has several pins for input and output. It can read an analog voltage with the analog to digital function. It also offers a Pulse width modulation output on a pin for motor control. The chip even supports serial output and input to drive a serial LCD screen as a display. The processor runs on 5 volts DC max or can run on 3 AA batteries at 4.5 volts for portable applications. Or you can go to the Delta Club webpage www.deltaclub.org click on Training Classes; then click on Technician Class to send an email, or call at 901-683-2701. We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set if you send an email informing us of your desire to be in a class.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual*, product #0977/ISBN 978-0-87259-097-7 (red-brick colored cover) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this manual. You can purchase it online from www.msars.com, www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com. The list price is \$29.95 (which includes a CD). The older ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition was priced at \$24.95, but did not have a CD.

The current Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at <http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356>. Testing for this question pool started July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, go to www.qrz.com. From the QRZ home page click on **RESOURCES** in the blue band on the top right. Then click on 2010 Technician Exam Practice Test. When you start answering the questions, it will show you if you answered correctly or not with **CORRECT!** or **SORRY BUT THAT ANSWER IS NOT CORRECT**. Statistics are kept below the test question at **This Quiz** with the number of questions answered correctly and the percentage correct. Also shown is the number of questions answered correctly from the 396 questions of the question pool. It keeps track of your correct answers on subsequent tests. Below the **This Quiz** line is **Questions in This Test**, that is a list of the 35 question numbers of the current test. If answered correctly, the question number radio button turns green. If answered incorrectly, it turns red.
